Partial damage was inflicted on a considerable number of other vehicles involved in the operation.

The journalist further alleges that the number of injured soldiers surpasses the official count, with 7,000 individuals affected, including 3,700 who are now permanently disabled. Most shockingly, Shimon claims that the actual death toll among Israeli soldiers and officers stands at a staggering 3,850, describing it as an unprecedented massacre in history.

Shimon raises critical questions about the government's reluctance to disclose the true scale of the losses, urging Prime Minister Netanyahu to address the nation honestly about the situation. The journalist questions why Netanyahu has not publicly acknowledged the failure to achieve the stated goals in the battle.

Furthermore, Shimon suggests that the Israeli military's ability to continue the conflict is only sustained through American support. He highlights the vulnerability of Israel's military capabilities, emphasizing that the U.S. backing is crucial, even if it appears to be waning. Shimon concludes by asserting that the capture of Al-Aqsa has returned to the Muslims, signaling a perceived decline in the State of Israel's influence.

As the nation grapples with these shocking revelations, there are growing calls for accountability and transparency from the Israeli government. The expulsion of Ariel Shimon has only intensified public curiosity about the true nature and toll of the conflict, leaving many demanding answers from their leaders.
